

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With 60 million tourists every year, Italy is a prime spot for pickpockets.

We recommend you leave all your valuables in the hotel safe and only carry a photocopy of your passport or driving licence with you.

When visiting the popular tourist attractions, particularly in Naples, make sure to keep your hand over the opening of any bags and do not leave wallets or phones in your pockets. Be extra careful with leaving phones sitting on tables at restaurants. The most important thing is to be smart and watch your items.

Visitors should also be wary of distractions that are created by pickpockets, and strangers 'accidently' bumping into you - a method that is frequently used to snatch a bag or wallet.



Tours 1 & 7 Naples

Monday AND Wednesday 09:00 - 17:00 including lunch Travel time to Naples is approximately 1h to 1h15 depending on traffic.

With an extensive collection of artefacts from Pompeii and Herculaneum, including exquisite mosaics and bronze sculptures, as well as antiquities from Greek, Roman and Renaissance times, the National Archaeological Museum (MANN) is one of the oldest and most important of its kind in the world.

The museum also houses the 'Secret Cabinet' (Gabinetto Segreto), the name the Bourbon Monarchy gave the private rooms in which they held their fairly extensive collection of erotic or sexual artefacts, mostly deriving from excavations of Pompeii and Herculaneum. Access at the time was, however, limited to persons of 'mature age and known morals...'

Antipasti and pizza will be served for lunch at the sea front restaurant Antonio & Antonio.

Participants will also visit the historical centre of the city and the Sansevero Chapel where they will discover the Veiled Christ, a masterpiece completed in 1753 by the Neapolitan artist Giuseppe Sanmartino.

Tours 2, 6 & 8 **Pompeii Ruins**

Monday AND Wednesday 08:30 - 12:30

Tuesday 14:00 - 18:00

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Step into the past with a tour of Pompeii's ancient ruins, preserved since the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in 79 AD. Participants on this half-day tour will discover streets, homes and public buildings that offer an insight into daily Roman life. Despite the devastation of the eruption, haunting remnants of the city remain, such as the Forum. Plaster casts of victims portray their plight, frozen for eternity. The intricate mosaics, colourful frescoes and architectural details all reveal the sophistication of Pompeii's civilization.

In 1997, UNESCO recognized Pompeii, Herculaneum, and the neighbouring areas for their extraordinary archaeological significance adding them to its World Heritage List.

Tour highlights will include the Palace of the Gladiators, a small theatre, Stabiana Street with its shops and restaurants, a private dwelling, thermal baths, a brothel and the Forum, the focal point of the main public buildings for the city's administration and justice, and the site of its trading activities. Also included, is a visit to the Antiquarium, where curated artefacts offer even deeper insights into Pompeii's history, customs, and tragic demise.





Tours 3, 5 & 9 Herculaneum

Monday AND Wednesday 14:00 - 18:00

Tuesday 08:30 - 12:30

Herculaneum might only be 15 kilometres away from Pompeii, but there is a significant difference in the level of preservation of the two sites. The difference lies in the direction in which the debris from Vesuvius' eruption travelled. Pompeii was right in the firing line as large chunks of rock, ash and superheated gases bore down on the town, causing huge structural damage as the city was buried. Herculaneum, however, avoided this rain of volcanic debris, and after suffering a pyroclastic blast which instantly killed all the residents, it was entirely buried under a layer of ash, which subsequently hardened, preserving much more of the town.

Pompei is the larger of the two sites and provides the visitor with a more complete impression of a Roman town, whereas Herculaneum offers a window into the private lives of an ancient culture. The buildings, some of which are two-storied, are almost entirely intact with delicate items preserved, such as exquisite mosaics, wooden structures and even food.

Tour 4 Capri & Positano

Tuesday 09:00 - 17:00 including lunch

The tour begins with a short transfer by minibus to the port of Sorrento before embarking on a private hydrofoil. Participants will enjoy panoramic views of the Amalfi Coast as the boat makes its way to the stunning island of Capri, passing by the iconic Faraglioni Rocks.

Upon arrival, the tour guides will accompany participants to the main square of Capri, la Piazzetta. From there, participants will have time to wander through the narrow streets lined with luxury shops, admire the ocean views from the island, and stop for a cappuccino at one of the many open-air cafes.

After a morning of exploration, participants will return to the hydrofoil and cruise along to the charming coastal town of Positano, where colourful cliffside houses cascade down to the azure waters below. Lunch will be at Ristorante l'Incanto, located directly on the beach.

After lunch participants will have some free time to explore Positano's charming streets, filled with art galleries and boutiques offering handmade ceramics, local fashion and artisanal goods. The Church of Santa Maria Assunta is also worth a visit, famous for its beautiful dome adorned with colourful majolica tiles.

When calling it is important to mention the reservation concerns the IPLOCA Convention.

Surrounded by a beautiful citrus garden with lemon, orange and grapefruit trees, the Hilton Sorrento Palace is a 15-minute walk to the historical centre of Sorrento, an ideal spot for shopping or enjoying the vibrant nightlife.

The hotel has just completed an extensive renovation and offers 331 guest rooms, the majority of which overlook the Bay of Naples and Mount Vesuvius, an idyllic setting that sets the stage for an unforgettable stay.

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Check-in/Check-out Times

Hotel check-in time is 16:00. Every effort will be made by the Hilton Sorrento Palace to accommodate guests arriving before the check-in time, however, rooms may not be immediately available.

Hotel check-out time is 12:00. Requests to retain rooms beyond this time should be directed to the front desk upon your arrival. Should it be possible to retain the room beyond the check-out time, a late departure charge may be applicable.

In order to secure a very early check-in or a very late check-out it is advisable to book the room for the night before, or for the following night.

Early Departure Fees

All guests are obliged to reconfirm their departure date with the Hotel's front desk staff upon check-in.

Hilton Sorrento Palace may charge IPLOCA Convention attendees an early departure fee equivalent to the daily room rate for those who depart prior to their confirmed departure date.

Smoking Policy

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Smoking is not allowed anywhere inside the hotel and all guest rooms are non-smoking rooms.

There is, however, a designated smoking room near the fireplace in the Sorrento Lounge on the ground floor, and smoking is permitted on the terrace of the hotel.

Convention Registration Information

Participation in the Annual Convention is a benefit of membership and is limited to representatives of IPLOCA Regular, Associate, and Corresponding Member companies, Academic Members, Honorary Members, IPLOCA's Media Partners, guests of members, and accompanying partners.

Retired pipeliners of IPLOCA member companies can also register for the Convention on condition that they have been invited as a 'guest' of one of IPLOCA's current members. The term 'guest' at the convention, means the person/couple has been invited to attend by a member. It does not mean the inviting company pays the convention fee for their 'guest.'

All IPLOCA Convention participants are required to reserve their accommodation at the hotel that has been selected for the convention, the Hilton Sorrento Palace.

IPLOCA makes a financial commitment to the hotel in order to guarantee availability of a specific number of rooms throughout the week. In return, the hotel is able to offer discounted room rates to all IPLOCA participants. If IPLOCA fails to meet the minimum room block commitment then penalty fees have to be paid.

All room reservations for delegates attending the IPLOCA Convention must only be made using the <u>registration form</u> that is available on the convention registration website at <u>www.iploca.com</u>.

We are unable to confirm convention registration if the room reservation has been made by any other means such as through travel agencies or other websites. All attendees must pay the convention registration fee unless they are a spouse of a registered attendee or are eligible for a complimentary registration fee.

IPLOCA always encourages delegates to bring their spouse with them to the convention. This is why the registration fee is structured so that the spouse is complimentary.

All other participants (including family members and guests) must pay the full registration fee with the exception of children under the age of 18, who pay 50% of the registration fee.

Partial registration is not available. Those persons who wish to only attend part of the programme have to pay the full registration fee.


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Room Reservation Cancellations

Passport & Visa Requirements

All international visitors require a passport that is valid for a minimum of three months after their travel dates to Italy.

Australian, USA and Canadian nationals do not require a visa for stays up to 90 days but must show documentation to border authorities to justify:

- the reason for their stay in Italy i.e., a convention invitation letter from IPLOCA.
- the duration of their stay in Italy i.e., a letter from the hotel as a guarantee of the room reservation.
- While not mandatory, it is advisable to have travel insurance that will cover any medical expenses, including those related to COVID-19.
- Before travelling, all nationals are advised to check whether they need to apply for a visa by answering a simple questionnaire on the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs website at https://vistoperitalia.esteri.it/home/en
- Participants from countries requiring a visa are strongly advised to submit their applications at least 12 weeks before their planned travel date.
- If you require an invitation letter from IPLOCA to accompany your visa application, please tick the appropriate box when registering for the convention and the IPLOCA Secretariat will send you one.

IPLOCA Arrival Transfers

From Naples International Airport (NAP) to the Hilton Sorrento Palace hotel

- The airport is 53 km from the hotel and the journey will take approximately one hour depending on traffic.
- Look for the IPLOCA signage after you exit the baggage-claim area.

IPLOCA Departure Transfers

From the Hilton Sorrento Palace hotel to Naples International Airport (NAP)

Saturday 14 September and Sunday 15 September

Open to all IPLOCA attendees, pre-registration required.

- We suggest you plan on arriving at the airport at least three hours before your flight departure time.
- A detailed transfer schedule will be available at the IPLOCA Registration Desk.

If you would like **to reserve a complimentary transfer** to or from the airport, please submit your request online when registering for the convention.

Detailed flight information must be provided for all arrival and departure transfer requests.

Transfers will only be provided for those persons who have received a confirmation email from the Secretariat.

If you are not arriving in Naples on Saturday or Sunday, 7 or 8 September, below is some information on how to get to the hotel.

Hotel Transfer Service

Rates are per vehicle, one way, VAT included.

To reserve a private transfer, send an email to <u>sales@russoagency.it</u> or call +39 081 807 1845, during Central European Summer Time (CEST) office hours.

A minimum of 48 hours' notice is required, and the cost can be charged to a credit card. Cancellations must be made at least 24 hours before the date of the transfer.

Taxi

Taxis are available outside the arrivals area of Naples Airport. However, to avoid having to wait in line for a taxi after a long flight, we advise you to book a taxi ahead of time. Fares vary depending on how many persons, and how much luggage you have.

There are multiple companies that provide this service online. We advise you to check that they confirm a fixed price for the transfer and that the company is able to provide the service in case of delayed or cancelled flights. Taxi drivers do not expect to be tipped in Italy, however, most locals round up the fare. If your driver goes out of his or her way to assist you, a small tip is appreciated.

Bus Service

Some shuttle bus companies operate services between Naples Airport and Sorrento. These buses typically drop passengers off at central locations in Sorrento from where you can take a taxi or walk to the Hilton Sorrento Palace: https://www.curreriviaggi.it/en/

Uber

Uber services are not available on the Amalfi Coast.

General Information

Time Zone

Italy is GMT + 1 hour.

Electricity & Voltage

The standard electricity output is 220V (50Hz). All sockets take the standard European two-pin plugs.

Water

The water in Sorrento is safe to drink. It is high in calcium (hard water) so some people prefer bottled water.

Safety

We advise you to exercise the usual caution when out and about. Sorrento generally has a safe environment, and petty crimes like pickpocketing or bag snatching are low compared to other major tourist destinations in Italy. However, be cautious in crowded areas, always stay alert and keep an eye on your belongings.

Call 112 for emergencies (police, fire or ambulance).

Climate & Clothing

Sorrento has warm and pleasant weather in September, with daytime temperatures ranging from 25°C to 30°C. However, evenings can be slightly cooler, around 20°C. We recommend wearing light clothing during the day, such as shorts, skirts, or summer dresses, and bringing an extra layer for the cooler evenings, such as a light jacket or sweater. Make sure to pack sunglasses and sunscreen.

Shopping

Shops are usually open seven days a week from 10:00 to 21:00, and most stores in the old town are open from 10:00 to 23:00 every day. The pedestrian area of Corso Italia, just a short walk down the hill from the Hilton Sorrento Palace, has many shops and cafes.

Smoking

Italy has strict regulations and smoking is generally prohibited in indoor public spaces including hotel rooms, restaurants, bars, shops, train stations, airports, cars and buses.

If smoking areas are available, they are indicated by a blue sign that says 'Area Fumatori.'

Tax

Value Added Tax (VAT), known as 'IVA' in Italian, is applied to most goods and services in Italy and is usually included in the listed prices of goods and services.

The standard VAT rate is 22%, although reduced rates of 10% or 4% may apply to certain items such as food, books and essentials.

Many cities and regions in Italy impose a tourist tax on overnight stays in hotels, bed and breakfasts, and rental apartments. The tax amount varies depending on the location and the category of accommodation. The tourist tax at the Hilton Sorrento Palace is currently EUR 4.00 per day, per person.





Eating Out

If there's one thing we know for sure, it's that you won't go hungry! It's hard to walk more than a few steps in Sorrento without passing by a restaurant... not to mention the cafés, pubs, wine bars, and gelato shops that line the streets downtown.

Traditional dishes and food from Sorrento

Sorrento is famous for its lemons and oranges, grown in local groves covered in traditional shades known as 'pagliarelle.' Local lemons are used to make lemon pasta, and the famous 'limoncello,' a traditional sweet liqueur served after meals. Taste homemade limoncello and lemon desserts at establishments like **Bar Gentile**.

Parmigiana di Melanzane: a vegetarian alternative to lasagna with layers of tomato and aubergine.

Gnocchi alla Sorrentina: fresh pasta tossed with tomato sauce and melted mozzarella.

Provolone del Monaco: a local soft cheese with a slightly sharp taste aged from 6 to 18 months.

Walnuts from Sorrento: used to make 'nocino,' an afterdinner liqueur.

Gelato: Finish your meal with artisanal gelato (ice cream) made with fresh, natural ingredients. **Gelateria Primavera** and **Raki** are among Sorrento's best known gelaterias.

Tipping

In some restaurants and cafes, a service charge known as 'coperto' or 'servizio,' may be added to your bill. This is a fixed charge for the service provided and is not a tip. Tipping is not obligatory in Italy, but leaving a small gratuity for good service is appreciated.

Do's and Don'ts

When visiting Italy it's essential to be mindful of local customs and cultural norms to ensure an enjoyable experience. Here are some do's and don'ts to bear in mind:

Do greet locals politely. Always greet locals with a smile and a friendly 'buongiorno' (good morning) or 'buonasera' (good evening) depending on the time of day.

Do say 'grazie' (thank you) and **'prego'** (you're welcome) frequently to show appreciation.

Do respect cultural sites. When visiting historical or cultural sites, do follow the rules and regulations, such as not touching artefacts or speaking loudly.

Do explore the local cuisine and try traditional dishes. Italians take pride in their food culture, so be open to new culinary experiences.

Do be patient. Service in restaurants and shops may be slower compared to other countries. Practice patience and enjoy the leisurely pace of life.

Don't wear revealing clothing, particularly when visiting churches or other religious sites.

Don't interrupt conversations. Italians value conversation and may find it rude if you interrupt or speak loudly in public places.

Don't skip the espresso. Coffee culture is important in Italy, so don't skip the opportunity to enjoy an espresso or cappuccino at a local cafe.
